Mama Halima's Story

Being a widow and a mother of 7 children (4 boys and 3 girls) with no source of constant income to fend for her family, life got even tougher upon the Corona period and mama Halima had no hopes of survival for the next meal but upon joining the seed food package program, there was light ahead. "I was constantly worried on where to get the next meal for my family as there was no any local business I could participate in to feed my children, it was even worse that one of them is a disable who needs to stay healthy with constant nutrition. Being in KidsCare program Children with Special abilities for my special child, KidsCare considered me as a priority for the seed food program. I received maize, peas seedlings, pesticides and fertilizer for farming.

There is now plenty of food in my home that I also started selling some of the harvest at the local market as a source of income. I am also planning to preserve some of maize and peas seeds for seedlings to use in the next farming season. Thankyou KidsCare for always being there for me and other needy people in our society"- she narrates .

Lina is a 26 year old single mother of two girls living in one of the poorest villages. Before joining the Community Based HomeCare Child protection and Bee Keeping program the family was living under unstable shelter as shown in the first photo, few months in the program, we are already seeing her efforts as she is constructing a new iron sheet house for her family through the monthly KidsCare cash transfer and from her little savings .

Mama Aisha is a widow and a mother of one living with her four grandchildren. Before joining the new home care program, she mainly depended on farming to meet her daily basic needs. Her three bedroomed house had no stable door and the children used to sleep on bare floor with poor beddings. Through the guidance of our social workers, mama Aisha is now running a small business of selling fried fish which enabled her to fix her door and improved the children beddings.

Giving special attention to children living with disabilities, we are grateful to all the stakeholders/parties who continues to join hands with us in provision of basic necessities to the families living with disable children. Our team also continues with home visits and gives more focus on support groups meetings to find emerging needs for intervention.

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
